



# A Focus on Recovery Support

**STR/ATR, or Access to Recovery, is a 6-month program that helps people in recovery from substance use disorders.**

## Services

MA-ATR provides vouchered services to help participants on the road to recovery. These recovery support services include:

- Basic Needs
- Employment services including job training
- Health and wellness support and services
- Transportation
- MA identification cards and driver’s licenses
- Recovery Coaching
- Re-entry support

## Who is Eligible to Participate in ATR?

*All participants must be involved with an outside agency/organization before being referred to ATR*

1. Has an opioid use disorder or is at risk for developing an opioid use disorder
2. Early in recovery process (approximately 2 years or less)
3. 18 years old or older
4. Massachusetts resident living in Boston, Hampden County, Worcester, or New Bedford and plans to remain there for at least the next six months
5. Connected with a case manager (or equivalent) in the recovery community
6. Identifies with one of the following groups:
  - Released from incarceration in the past two years
  - Participant in a Massachusetts Drug Court or Veterans Court
  - Served in the U.S. Military
  - Woman who is pregnant, postpartum, or parenting a child under age 18 who lives with her
  - In a medication assisted treatment program
