## **Know Your Voting Rights**

Have you ever been impacted by the criminal justice system?

In Massachusetts, if you are 18 or older and a citizen ...

Are you currently awaiting trial or have charges pending? Any charges – misdemeanor or felony.  Are you currently held in pre-trial detention?  Are you currently incarcerated on a misdemeanor conviction?	You can vote in
Are you on parole or probation?	all elections!
Have you spent time incarcerated but are <b>now released</b> ?	
But I have <b>felony convictions</b>	1
Are you currently civilly committed?	1

The voting laws differ from state to state. In Massachusetts, your right to vote is only taken away if you are currently incarcerated on a felony conviction. Then, the *moment* you are released, you become eligible to register to vote in Massachusetts.
